BOARD ACTION:

Mr. Engle made a motion to approve the personnel items as listed. Second by Mr. Frederick and approved on a roll call vote of 9-0.

B) Budget and Finance

1) Donation - The Board was requested to approve a donation from PASTA of \$10,000.00 to be utilized for the high school stage lighting and electrical upgrades.

DISCUSSION:

Mrs. Lingg thanked PASTA and indicated that the group visited Carlisle and Tim talked to other specialists and this project is overdue and the donation is much appreciated.

BOARD ACTION:

Mr. Engle made a motion to approve the donation as presented. Second by Mr. Frederick and approved on a roll call vote of 9-0.

2) 2017-2018 General Fund Budget Approval - The Board was requested to approve a tax millage increase for the 2017-2018 General Fund Budget of 0.63 mills (2.95%) from 21.36 to 21.99 mills and an expense level of \$32,096,746. In addition the Board is requested to approve the per capita tax (Act 679) for \$5.00, the per capita tax (Act 511) for \$5.00 and the occupational tax at \$10.00. In addition, the earned income tax at 0.5% and real estate transfer tax at 0.5%.

DISCUSSION:

Mrs. Lingg indicated that budget is talked about all the time at Budget and Finance Meetings which are held twice a month prior to the board

meetings. Budget development begins in December.

BOARD ACTION:

Mr. Roland made a motion to approve the general fund budget as presented. Second by Mr. Frederick and approved on a roll call vote of 9-0.

3) Homestead/Farmstead Approval - The Board was requested to approve the receipt and disbursement of \$574,151.56 (\$574,986.70 prior year) from the state as part of the Act 1 tax reduction. The result is a reduction on the assessment of approved homestead properties of approximately \$8,344, this equates to approximately \$183.48 in tax reduction for approved homesteads (enclosure PA) (enclosure York County)

DISCUSSION:

Mrs. Lingg indicated this dollar amount from the state has been stagnant for some time.

BOARD ACTION:

Mr. Engle made a motion to approve to approve the homestead/ Farmstead as presented. Second by Mr. Frederick and approved on a roll call vote of 9-0.

4) Installment Payment of Taxes Schedule - The Board was requested to approve the installment payment dates of taxes as first installment due September 5, 2017, second installment due October 2, 2017, and third installment due November 1, 2017. To qualify for the installment payments the first installment payment must be paid by the due date. A 10% penalty will be added to installment payments paid after the installment due date. All properties will be eligible for installment payment of taxes.

BOARD ACTION:

Mr. Reck made a motion to approve the installment payment of taxes schedule as presented. Second by Mrs. Shea and approved on a roll call vote of 9-0.

Tax Assessment Appeal Settlement - The Board was requested to approve for settlement of the tax assessment appeal litigation (Case No. 2009-SU-005192-08) for Tax Parcel 67-000-19-0039.00-00000, Carlisle Street, Hanover Borough, York County, Pennsylvania owned by P.R. Financing Ltd., Partnership, for a total assessed value as follows: effective for local and county taxes, as follows:

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2010, and school taxes on July 1, 2010 in the amount of \$25,237,750;

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2011, and school taxes on July 1, 2011, in the amount of \$25,000,000;

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2012, and school taxes on July 1, 2012, in the amount of \$24,750,000;

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2013, and school taxes

on July 1, 2013, in the amount of \$24,500,000;

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2014, and school taxes on July 1, 2014 in the amount of \$24,250,000;

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2015, and school taxes on July 1, 2015, in the amount of \$16,280,000;

Effective for local and county taxes on January 1, 2016, and school taxes on July 1, 2016, in the amount of \$14,734,500.

The District administration and solicitor are authorized to take all steps necessary to effectuate this settlement and to resolve this pending tax assessment appeal case.
