

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

### Middle School & Washington Elementary Collab

Hanover Middle School students recently had the opportunity to visit first grade classes at Washington Elementary School! This collaboration began as 7th and 8th grade students were exploring their interests with Mrs. Myers, Gifted Instructor at HMS. Several

students expressed a desire to be a teacher. As a result, Mrs. Myers and students decided they would like to collaborate with elementary students to help them in some way. As this project got underway, students were given the option to write a children's book or create a math game that would later be shared with the first graders.

Mrs. Myers reached out to Mrs. Sherry Knox and Miss Jessica Schlecter, two first grade teachers at

Washington Elementary School. Together, the teachers and students worked on identifying appropriate skills and concepts to include in their projects. Stu-

dents who chose to write children's books used Canva, a graphic design tool, to write and illustrate their books. Students creating math games took advantage of our 3D printers to design and print game pieces.

This collaboration was an extremely valuable experience for our students. Students learned to create clear objectives and directions for a much younger audience. These projects also provided students the opportunity to practice commu-

nication and collaboration skills with each other and with the first graders. Overall, this was a wonderful event for our middle school and elementary students alike!

Hanover High School offers a robust selection of 19 Advanced Placement (AP) courses for our students. These courses offer our students the opportunity to take college-level classes and potentially receive college credit after taking their AP exams in May. Courses are offered in the disciplines of Art, Computer Science, English, Math, Music, Social Studies, and World Languages. Last year we had 124 students take AP courses at Hanover High School!

## Hanover Foundation For Excellence Tax Credit Donations Welcomed

Act 4 of 2001 amends the Public School Code to provide for the establishment of the Educational Improvement Tax Credit to be administered by the Department of Community and Economic Development. Act 4 authorizes the award of tax credits to businesses that make contributions to scholarship organizations or educational improvement organizations included on the list of organizations published by the Department.
