
A Message from Superintendent Dr. John A. Scola

The Hanover Public School District is "Committed to Excellence" as we continually improve and expand opportunities for all students. It is crucial that the facilities are able to meet the demands of the expanding student population. Thus, improvements to the facilities are future-focused

and inextricably linked to student success and community pride.

The competition gymnasium at the High School will be totally renovated this summer. The practice gym was completely refurbished this past summer and both gymnasiums will now be refinished for the start of the 2019-2020 school year. The athletic facilities will be in excellent condition for practice and competitions and the student athletes will be able to take advantage of first-class facilities.

There are three major projects at the Middle School. The Middle School cafeteria will be totally renovated. The cafeteria is not large enough to accommodate the current population of students. The expansion will include a food court, enlarged cooking and storage stations, and a new back wall to replace the current curtain system. Ad-



Secondly, the current "woodshop" will be completely refurbished. Up-to-date woodworking machines are being ordered along with new furniture. The entire

space will be repainted. In preparation for careers at the High School, various technological equipment will be placed in the room as well - 3D printer, mini-CNC mills, laser engraver, etc. This Career Exploration Lab will enable the students to properly prepare for course offerings at the High School.

Lastly, the Middle School is receiving a new intercom system. This new system will serve several practical purposes and importantly improve communication throughout the school. This enhanced communication is an important component for safety drills and potential emergencies.

Hanover is a special and proud community. The ongoing enhancements to the facilities reflect Hanoverian pride and the district's commitment to the citizens and the students.







### Grant Funding & Generous Donations

Hanover Public School District was recently awarded a PA Smart Targeted Grant in the amount of \$35,000 for computer science and STEM initiatives for teachers and students in grades K-8. The District is building partnerships with Har-



risburg University, Guthrie Memorial Library, The Academy for Media Production, as well as local builders and photographers to instruct students in the use of autonomous vehicles in the workplace.

In addition to this PA Smart Grant the District received generous donations from the Hanover Shoe Farms Foundation and Ox Industries. The funds received from both benefactors will allow the district to totally renovate the woodshop in the Middle School at no cost to the taxpayers. The District is sincerely grateful for their continued support.

Hanover Public School District currently offers computer science at all levels through elementary STEAM, Fourth grade ILC classes, Middle School Specials, a 7th grade daily STEAM class, as well as extensive courses in computer science at Hanover High School, leading to AP Computer Science Principles, including credentialing opportunities.

### **Learning Real Workplace Skills**

Mechatronics is a multidisciplinary field of science that includes a combination of mechanical engineering, electronics, computer engineering, telecommunications engineering, systems engineering, and control engineering. This includes wiring circuits, reading electrical and mechanical

blueprints, troubleshooting and repairing electromechanical systems, using the tools/equipment of the industry, and understanding the safety standards for each operation.

The main goal of the Hanover High School Mechatronics

Program is to provide students with the skills necessary to enter the workforce. There is a high demand for skilled workers in Mechatronics within our immediate area. The Mechatronics Program enables us to prepare students for viable career opportunities through our partnership with Utz Quality Foods, and additional manufacturing facilities within our community.

Additionally, Hanover High School has partnered with the HACC-Gettysburg Mechatronics Program to receive instructor training and program development, allowing for courses



completed in the high school to articulate as credits in college, should a student enter the HACC-Gettysburg program. The first two courses in the high school (Electronics &

Electricity, and Motors & Controls) expose students to AC motor starters and control systems, DC integrated circuits, analog and digital logic control, soldering, pneumatics, using a multimeter, and troubleshooting control systems. These courses also have robotics inte-

grated into the curriculum. Students have the opportunity to program robots to complete a given task using sensors rather than human input.

Hanover High School currently boasts 20 students in the Mechatronics Program. Students who successfully complete the Mechatronics Program and all of the required competencies have the potential to earn a microcredential from Hanover High School, as well as 8 articulated credits toward the Mechatronics Program at HACC-Gettysburg.

# School District Performance & Financial Audits

Two periodic audits of the Hanover Public School district were recently conducted. In each audit the District had no findings indicating material inadequacy. Both audits verified outstanding financial practices and procedures.

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania Department of the Auditor General conducted a Performance Audit dated January 2019 for the period of July 2013 through June of 2017. Areas reviewed included financial stability, transportation operations, administrative contracts, and bus driver requirements. The audit found the District performed flawlessly in these areas.

The annual financial statement fiscal audit for the 2017-2018 school year was conducted by an independent accounting firm, as required. This audit concluded with an unqualified opinion which represents the financial statements are presented fairly with no audit findings.
